

# NEARBY ATTRACTIONS

- **Antwerpen-Centraal Station**, one of the most beautiful railway stations in the world, just a short walk from the venue.
- **Meir Shopping Street**, the city's main commercial avenue, lined with historic buildings and international shops. Nearby, **Kammenstraat** adds a trendier, alternative touch, while the **Wilde Zee** area offers cozy narrow streets with small boutiques and cafés.
- If the weather is pleasant, consider a walk through **Zuidpark** and the surrounding **Nationalestraat** and **Kloosterstraat**. This area offers a refined mix of green spaces, boutiques, and design stores, making it an enjoyable part of the city to explore on foot.
- **Hendrik Conscienceplein**, a quiet historic square dominated by the Baroque **Carolus Borromeus Church** and surrounded by elegant façades. It is also an inviting spot to stop for a drink and enjoy the square's refined atmosphere.
- **Het Steen**, a landmark medieval fortress on the **Scheldt** waterfront. Its recent renovation has transformed it into a contemporary visitor gateway, offering insights into the city's history and a striking view of the river.
- **Zoo of Antwerp**, one of the oldest zoos in Europe, adjacent to the station.
- **Museum aan de Stroom (MAS)**, an iconic museum by the port featuring exhibitions on the city's history and identity, plus a free panoramic rooftop.
- **KMSKA – Royal Museum of Fine Arts Antwerp**, recently reopened after a major renovation, with an exceptional collection of Flemish and modern art.
- **Cathedral of Our Lady**, a Gothic cathedral housing masterpieces by **Rubens**.
- **Grote Markt and City Hall**, a historic square with guild houses and the Renaissance-style town hall.
- **Chocolate shops and Belgian cafés**, ideal for tasting local specialties.

## Typical beers

- **De Koninck “Bolleke”**, Antwerp's most iconic beer; amber, smooth, and very easy to drink.
- **Tripel d'Anvers**, a modern tripel brewed by De Koninck; aromatic and slightly spiced.
- **Duvel**, a strong, well-known blond beer originating from the Antwerp region.
- **La Chouffe**, a fruity, slightly spiced blond beer, popular with locals and visitors alike.
- **Tripel Karmeliet**, a classic Belgian tripel known for its refined balance, soft fruitiness, and creamy texture.
